Veteran's Day Breakfast and Assembly

We want to recognize the sacrifices of all veterans and their families.

From the Desk of Mr. Coffelt

Lamoni Community,

In the 1950s, Iowa had over 4,000 school districts. Students could walk to their neighborhood school and transportation costs were nonexistent for Iowa school districts. As budgets have tightened and enrollments continue to decline, Iowa now has 333 districts (FY 2017) with varying square miles per pupil and hugely varying transportation costs.

Iowa's current school funding formula does not recognize the sparseness of population, square mileage or route miles for school districts, the number of students transported, or variance in road or geographic conditions. As a result, districts with large transportation costs cover those costs out of the school general fund, negatively impacting the amount spent on educating students in the classroom.

The following statistics describe current transportation inequities today from the latest available Transportation Report from the Department of Education for Fiscal Year 2015:

FY 2015 State cost per pupil was \$6,366. There were an estimated 41 Iowa school districts that required at least 10% of that general fund cost per pupil for transportation expenses.

- The range in transportation expenditures varies from a low of \$57.82 to a high of \$980.87 per student enrolled. During this same year, Lamoni spent \$582.56 per student enrolled.
- Square miles per district range from a low of 2 to a high of 555 square miles, and route miles range from a low of 4,771 to a

high of 1,264,105 miles. Lamoni traveled 25,399 during this same period for regular and activity routes.

General fund dollars spent on busing would otherwise be available for staff and teachers (salary, benefits, training, and support), curriculum, programs, technology, and energy. Lack of resources in all of these areas creates an unequal educational opportunity for students in rural districts.

As one action to address continually increasing transportation expenses, Lamoni began leasing their buses through Thomas Bus Sales this school year. This change from Durham School Services provided a net decrease in costs of \$35,000 on an annual basis. The District will continue to look at routes, route miles and all associated expenses in order to provide a safe and efficient ride for our students and student-athletes this school year.

The Iowa State Legislature also looked at a bill last year that would change the funding formula to help address this inequity for school districts, allowing us to focus our resources on serving students in the classroom. While it did not pass out of committee, I am hopeful the bill will garner more attention and support this legislative session.
