From the Desk of Mr. Coffelt

Lamoni Community,

Right before Christmas, the Iowa Department of Education released results of the Iowa School Performance Profile, which can be accessed at the following link: <u>Iowa School Performance Profile</u>

The Every Student Succeeds Act, ESSA, replaces the No Child Left Behind Act and provides a new set of federal requirements that maintains a focus on school accountability and equity for all students.

ESSA requires all states to publish report cards reflecting the performance of the state, schools and school districts. Iowa's new report card is called the Iowa School Performance Profile. The Iowa School Performance Profiles reflect the core measures that contribute to a school's accountability determination, which include the following:

- Student participation on state
 assessments
- Academic achievement (proficiency and average scale score)
- Student growth
- Graduation rate
- Progress in achieving English language proficiency
- Conditions for Learning Report, a student survey of safety and engagement

Each school receives an overall score based on performance on these measures. Schools also receive a score for each subgroup of students, such as students with a disability or students who qualify for free and reduced lunch.

The Iowa School Performance Profile are not the same as the Iowa School Report Card, which was launched in 2015, in response to a state legislative requirement. Because the School Report Card is still an Iowa legislative requirement, there will be another school report card release in the Spring of 2019.

However, some overlap between the two exists, and the Iowa Department of Education will merge the Iowa School Performance Profile and the Iowa School Report Card in fall 2019 so that Districts and school communities have one report card that meets both state and federal requirements.

ESSA requires to states to identify schools that need the most support, for purposes of ensuring students have the same opportunities for success that exist for students in other schools.

A school will be identified for Comprehensive Support and Improvement if its overall score fall within the lowest 5% of Title I schools in the state or its graduation rate fall below 67.1%. A school will be identified for Targeted Support and Improvement if a student subgroup score is as low as the lowest 5% of schools in the state.

In the Iowa School Performance Profile, *Lamoni CSD met student achievement requirements* and has *not* been labeled as a Comprehensive or Targeted Support School. In fact, there is much to celebrate in our student data, especially as we compare to state average student proficiency scores and student growth, an indicator that Iowa's new accountability system places the greatest emphasis on.

A new measure on this profile is the Conditions for Learning, which Iowa introduced last year as an annual student survey of engagement, safety and overall learning environment. Students in grades 5-12 took the survey in spring 2018. Survey results represent one of the measures used this year to determine accountability scores for Iowa Schools.

Research shows students who feel safe, actively engaged in their learning and build positive relationships with others are more likely to succeed in school and beyond.

The survey will expand to students in grades 3-12 in the spring of 2019. Survey results will serve as a tool to help schools, teachers, and parents identify areas of strength, as well as areas that may need attention. For students, the survey is an important opportunity to be here and to be a part of efforts to improve the learning environment.

As we review each of the data sets that comprise the new profile, we renew our commitment to support every one of our students every day and reinvest in our mission to prepare students to realize their fullest potential for success in each of their chosen endeavors.
