From the Desk of Mr. Coffelt

Lamoni Community,

As I write this article, we have no snow on the ground and above normal temperatures. I'm not complaining, as I am ready for spring. This weather does make me wonder what the end of March will be like if we are starting "like a lamb". While I consider what spring may bring, I also consider the work we have left in order to finish this school year successfully.

April 15 is a significant date for the school district this spring, as this is when our district budget must be certified. The certified budget establishes the levies for each of our school funds and corresponding tax rates. As we develop our budget, our primary goal is to use the financial resources we have to continue to provide a quality educational program for the students and families we serve. We balance this primary goal with two secondary goals: 1) Maintain funding that provides for the long-term stability and vitality of the district. And, 2) Be a good community partner through the maintenance of an appropriate school district property tax levy. This commitment can be evidenced through a continued a trend downward from the 2011 property tax levy rate of \$18.77 per mil to this year's current \$17.86.

Providing a quality educational program, living within district revenues and maintaining good financial health requires constant monitoring throughout the year to ensure sound budget management. The preparation of the budget actually commences in October, with the certified enrollment count of students we serve. The certified enrollment provides the basis upon which the district receives property tax and state aid for the following fiscal year, beginning July 1. Our district enrollment increased 15 students this year, providing for a total count of 322 students in Kindergarten through 12th grade.

Fiscally sound practices and review of our budget throughout the year ensure we not only meet the needs of the students and families we currently serve, but also those needs of future generations of students and families. We will continue to strategically focus staff and resources on programs and services that provide the greatest educational impact on student learning and achievement.

My hopes are for not only for continued warmer weather, but continued student success academically and athletically as well this spring. Thank you for your ongoing support of our students, our staff and this District.
