Dress For the Weather!

Unexpected Dismissal Plans

It is important to have plans in place for your child for unexpected early dismissals. Please take the opportunity to discuss these plans with your child to be prepared when situations occur. The school will **NOT** be calling parents to notify them of unexpected early dismissals. Parents can listen to the radio, watch for announcements on TV, or check the school website. Parents with emails on JMC will receive an email notification or text message when school is dismissed early.
